That I may know Him, and <u>the power of His resurrection</u> and the <u>fellowship of His sufferings</u>, being conformed to *His death*; in order that I may attain to the <u>resurrection from the dead</u>. (Phil 3:10-11)

He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, that we might <u>die to sin</u> and <u>live to righteousness</u>; for *by His strips* you were <u>healed</u>. (1 Pet 2:24)

Who *gave Himself* for us, that He might <u>redeem us from every lawless deed</u> and <u>purify</u> for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds. (Tit 2:14)

By this will, we have been <u>sanctified</u> through the offering (sacrifice) of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. (Heb 10:10)

For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified. (Heb 10:14)

To Him who loves us and released us from our sins by His blood. (Rev 1:5b)

Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him. (Rom 5:9)

For if while we were enemies, we were <u>reconciled to God</u> through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be <u>saved</u> by His life. (Rom 5:10)

For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of *His death*, certainly we shall be also in the <u>likeness of *His resurrection*</u>. (Rom 6:5)
